“Jesus said to them, ‘I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.’” ~John 6:35

Sisters and brothers,

This summer, Elena and I have discovered the PBS show *The Great British Baking Show*. It is a baking competition from England, where twelve amateur bakers compete (and are slowly eliminated one by one) to become the “Star Baker.” I confess I was skeptical at first- I’m not a big fan of reality television. However, this show is so engaging, the judges critical, but kind, and the contestants do not attempt to undercut one another, but instead encourage each other, applauding one another’s successes, and consoling in failures.

Each week has a different theme, and for me, the episode that really struck a chord was the week titled “Bread.” Bread is something that humans have been eating since time can remember. It is classic; it is sustaining; it has been vital to our very survival at times.

But bread can also demand a few things. First, it demands attention: it has to be kneaded and rolled *just* right. Second, it demands patience: the yeast must be given plenty of time to mature, and dough enough time to rise (but not *too* much time!). Depending on the type of bread you are making, the recipe will change. It takes a lot to make a *good* loaf of bread.

The lectionary has us linger over the sixth chapter of John’s gospel for the course of about five weeks this August. It is “the bread chapter.” From the beginning to the end, Jesus as the bread of life and bread of heaven is the theme. He begins the chapter by literally feeding five thousand people (v. 1-14); the chapter ends with Jesus foreshadowing the eucharistic meal, that *he* will be the bread and wine that they eat and drink (something the people gathered have a very difficult time understanding).

All of this has gotten me thinking about what feeds *us*. When I watch *The Great British Baking Show*, I confess that my mouth waters at the sight of extraordinary, delicious looking cakes, pies, biscuits, and tarts. Yet at the same time, I know that these will only fill me temporarily. I will eventually be hungry again. But what is going to feed me in a way that sustains me, in a way that I will not be hungry again? Quite simply: the life and love of Jesus.

Yet that life and love of Jesus comes to us in many forms. I could give examples, but I want to know what feeds *you*. What nourishes your spirits? What feeds your soul? What fills you in ways that you don’t need filling again? Is it a shared meal around the tables of Fellowship Hall? Is it a bible or book study with friends? Is it getting your hands dirty constructing a house with Habitat for Humanity? *What feeds you?*

This isn’t just rhetorical- I really want to know! So over the next month or so, come find me! Let’s sit down and talk about just what it is that feeds you, that fills you, that builds you up for the sharing and living of the gospel. Because the life and love of Jesus that we have encountered is a life and love that needs to be shared- like a good, tasty bread.

## Family Promise News

WPC will host Family Promise families for 4 weeks throughout the calendar year. There will be up to 4 families with a maximum of 14 persons. Families are screened for drug use and abuse of alcohol.

Families will sleep in the upstairs rooms. We will work with CTNS to make the families and the preschoolers welcome.

The weekly schedule below shows how Family Promise will happen at WPC.

On the first Sunday,

- we will **set up** the rooms with air mattresses, lay out linens, blankets, and towels, and other items for each room.
- The families will be greeted at 5:00 PM by 2 church members and explained the room usage – Fellowship Hall; bathrooms downstairs and in basement; refrigerator in kitchen, snacks, juice, milk; kitchen to make lunches; and rooms in the basement. No use of sanctuary, parlor, or office. No smoking in building.
- Then at 5:30 PM, the congregation will have a pot luck with the families and some sort of activity to welcome the families to WPC.

Each week day,

- At 7 AM, the families will leave for the Day Center in Lyons where they will go to school, get services, and head to work.
- **From 5:00- 8:30 PM, 2-4 Volunteers** are needed. The volunteers could be a couple of friends, a church family, or a church group.
  - At 5 PM, the families will be welcomed back to the church
  - At 5:30 PM, a **support group** (Lions, Macedon Baptist, Zion Episcopal, Palmyra Reformed) will bring in dinner which the **volunteers** will get ready to serve for 6 PM. **Volunteers** will get the tables set with the help of families and eat with the families. Volunteers and families will clean up and families will make lunches for the next day.
  - Until 8:30 PM, families will go about their family tasks, homework, TV, games, reading, etc.

Each evening from **8:30 PM to 7:00 AM overnight hosts** will be present.

- We need one male and one female each evening. They will spend the night sleeping, being present if something happens.
- In the morning, they will be sure breakfast is out for the families. And the kitchen is picked up for the evening.
- Families leave for the Day Center in Lyons at 7 AM.

On Saturday,

- the church family may join the families for a potluck breakfast from 7:30 to 9:00 AM. Families tell the overnight hosts if they will return for dinner.
- The families will leave to spend the day with family or friends or to go to the Day Center.
- The families will return to the church at 5:00 PM for a typical evening.

On Sunday morning,

- Families will pack up and be ready to leave at 9:00 AM.
- Families will have breakfast at the church, like on weekday mornings.
- Families are invited to stay for church.
- Families go to spend the day with family or friends or go to the day center.

After worship, (**Take down**)

- Deflate mattresses and pack to take to next host church.
- Take down and store items from each overnight room.
- Volunteer washes bedding and then packs it for next Family Promise week at WPC.
