Pivotal experiences in our faith journey

Job 42:5 "My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you."

We may have a pivotal experience in our faith journey. Some people have a dramatic moment to accept God in their lives as God answered their urgent and desperate prayers. Some others encounter God in an unexpected way in which their prayer is answered differently from what they asked for, but they undeniably know it is the work of God. Recently, I officiated the funeral of someone who one day felt overwhelmed by the presence of the Spirit inside of her, so she had to drive her car into a nearby field where she had an overwhelming experience to be surrounded by a mysterious power. All of these experiences are linked to significantly positive outcomes to make them accept God in their lives.

Some people talk about their negative pivotal experiences that led them to doubts or uncertainties about God's presence or God's love. An onslaught of tragedy against them makes them conclude that God is non-existent, unloving or uncaring. How to deal with such a negative experience in our lives or what to say to someone who has been through it would be another topic to cover. But what I'd point out here is that there are people who attain profound understandings about God through their catastrophic experiences. They understand suffering as pointing to something else beyond themselves.

What is common between the two very different kinds of experience to work as a defining moment of faith? What makes one choose or discover faith in the midst of such experiences rather than going in the opposite direction? No one can choose it for someone else or force him/her to interpret such an experience in a certain manner, which I find myself doing numerous times. What is a secret ingredient to make our experience a spiritual one in a deeper level?

There is a hint from Philippians 2:5~10. This passage is called "The Hymn of Christ" because biblical scholars assume that this was an actual hymn that was sung in worship by the early church. This passage explains how Jesus was obedient to the Father God to accomplish the mission of saving humanity. According to the hymn, the first step he took was to empty himself (verses 6&7).

Self-emptying is the very first step to enable us to accept God and find our goal in God's purpose for our life. We humbly put ourselves before God and align our hearts to God, pleasantly subordinating our will to God's will. God uses our positive experiences to help us know that a good result doesn't come on its own but through God's goodness that makes everything work together. However, it is also true that many people view their success or accomplishment as a process toward self-centered and egotistical pride, which inevitably incurs a fear of rejection, as they get sucked into a constant state of needing to achieve more and more to prove themselves. Our positive experiences bring a positive outcome when we discover God who works in and through us, such as Peter in Luke 5 when he caught a lot of fish after heeding Jesus' instructions. He said to Jesus, "Depart from me for I am a sinful man." This is a good example of turning a positive experience to self-emptying.

It is not always the case, but our negative experiences make us empty ourselves more easily and naturally, as we admit that we are failing at life. We humbly acknowledge we need God's forgiveness and direction for our lives. Eventually, we have less desire to seek our own achievements but try to take delight in God. When we are truly hurt to the core by a catastrophic experience, we don't ask ourselves if we will get through it, but instead we ask ourselves how we will get through it. This is a time we find God's gentle whisper that speaks in a still and small voice to us every moment. Thus, self-emptying becomes a source of self-loving.

It is such a blessing to have a pivotal moment in our faith journey. How dramatic it is does not matter. If it is a positive or negative one, it does not matter either. When we find God at the end of this experience, it brings genuine or lasting acceptance of God with true joy and peace. When we get to this point, we confess to God like Job, "My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you." (Job 42:5)




Women's Circle is starting up Wednesday, September 18th
