Thanks to everyone who made, baked, and sold pies for **Family Promise of Wayne County.** As of July 13th, we have made over \$300.

Success Rate - 54 of 62 - 87% (73 adults and 149 children) of entering sheltered families have graduated from the program since we opened our doors to the first family on October 20, 2018. Our Roof Over Their Heads (ROTH) program started in August of 2021 and has since provided one-time financial assistance to 198 families as of March 14th. That is 226 adults and 435 children.

There is currently 1 family in shelter in Newark.

Present: Phil Opdycke, James McFarlane, Gary LaBerge, and Don Dantz

- 1. The meeting started with a prayer.
- 2. Gary presented the lease as reviewed by the lawyer. The committee reviewed it. A copy was sent to Janet and discussed with Bruce Chapman.
- 3. We talked briefly about the planning of an electronic sign on the front right of the church. Phil will plant the seed. Depending on the design, anything from \$6,000 to \$12,000. The \$20,000 is made of brick.
- 4. The hot water boiler pump is not functioning. Gary will call for Emcor assistance.
- 5. There were several times that the fire detection system reported last week. We need 2 phones, and the phone line is still pushing some interference. It could be all sorts of loose wires. So, we will look into it.
- 6. We will contact Emily, our cleaner, and decide on times for the semiannual cleaning dates.
- 7. The display on the new hot water boiler has failed, so Emcor will be contacted to fix the screen. It was hoped we could fix it in the summer. They stated a cost of \$2,720 to replace it.
- 8. Gary reported that he built four shelves and put up a door for the CE closet. Phil will paint the shelves.
- 9. Gary will purchase more plastic tubs for storage. Cost for the construction is about \$650.
- 10.We will contact K & D disposal to change the garbage dumpster to a larger garbage dumpster because of VBS and then leading into Little Froggies. It is once a week.
- 11.Steve Kennard installed a new clock that runs the front porch door light. Gary found two new ones. Steve swapped one of them out.
- 12. The committee is seeking Session permission to dispose of the seventy year-old organ that is in the Mary Griffith room. Jack says it does not work. Disposal TBD.
- 13. We received the HDMI extender system package. James tried to get it started, and it didn't work.
- 14. We are looking into putting in a new ball valve to replace the old water intake. First, we had to find where it was. It is located in the organ pump room.
