People of God at WPC,

I was reminded this week about a memoir I read a few years ago: Cheryl Strayed’s memoir, *Wild: From Lost to Found on the Pacific Crest Trail*. In her book, Strayed recounts hiking a large portion of the Pacific Crest trail in California and Oregon. The trip itself extends from the California border with Mexico, winding its way through mountains and valleys all the way to the Washington border with Canada. Strayed describes the low point her life had reached following the death of her mother, her subsequent attempts to numb the pain she experienced with drugs and alcohol, when she set out on this pilgrimage alone. However, even though she begins alone, and has to learn how to live and hike alone on the trail, she develops some very interesting, life-changing relationships.

The story of our faith is packed with stories about journeys. As I write this, we are concluding the last days of Christmas, about to celebrate the Epiphany, where we remember the Magi who traveled a great distance to honor the child Jesus, whose own ministry is one long journey toward Jerusalem. If we look at scripture closely, we notice that Jesus is never in one place very long and is most often teaching and healing “on the way” to someplace else.

Our faith journeys - both individually and as a community - involve the coming alongside of others for a time, much as Strayed found herself meeting fellow travelers on the PCT.

Sometimes those fellow hikers are with us for days or weeks, while others we travel with for only a few miles. But the time together need not be long for the impact to be meaningful.

This past year has been one filled with difficulties - anxieties, stresses we never saw coming, pain, loss. Many of us have entered this new year with a sense of relief at having closed the book on 2020, while others of us are more cautious about what is to come. Wherever you are on the way, let us remember that quote, often attributed to Ralph Waldo Emerson: “life is a journey, not a destination.”

Of course, I would add to that this: the journey is meant to be shared with whoever you are walking with at the moment. Share your story with someone; listen to theirs. In the midst of that sharing, maybe we will discover that we are journeying toward the same destination after all.

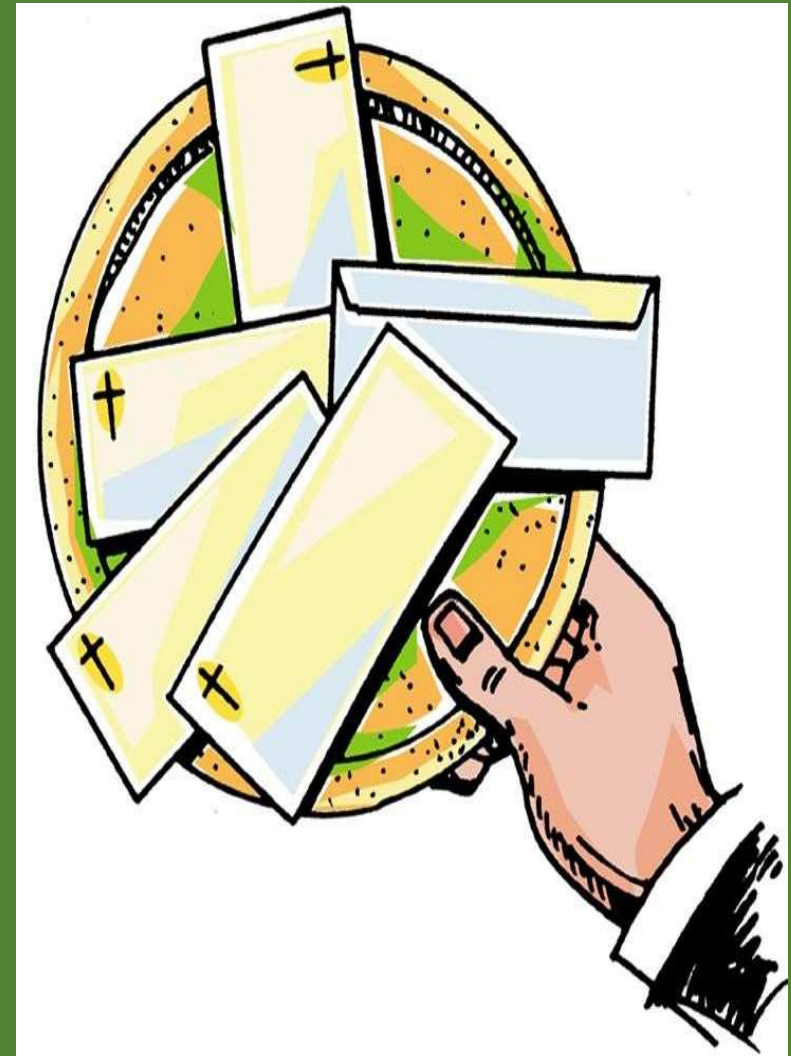
