

## November 2, 2022

Meeting was opened with scripture (Good Samaritan) and prayer.

Thank you to Sally and Ruth for Coffee Hour for October 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Disbursement checks have not yet been received. Irene will send a reminder to Val and Bill.

The FRAC.org (Food Research & Action Center) October Newsletter will be sent out by Edie.

There was action by Congress for "Healthy Meals, Healthy Kids Act" (HR 8450.) Another email will be sent to the congregation, encouraging the congregation to write to John Katko and possibly Claudia Tenney to support that H.R. 8450. <u>https://frac.org/action/bills-we-are-supporting</u> lists more information.

**Healthy Ninos** in Honduras – November Shoe Collection – reminder that Hondurans are small people. Rena put an ad for shoe collection in the Spire and there is a box in the sanctuary for the collection.

**Food Pantry update** 60 Thanksgiving dinner boxes will be made. Tickets with the time for pickup will be given to families for them to pick up boxes on Nov. 19<sup>th</sup>. Boxes will be packed beginning at 8:30 on the 19<sup>th</sup>.

Edie attended Food Pantry Board meeting in October. She and the committee brainstormed ways to get Weekend Wellness Food to the families from the food pantry. Pal-Mac Schools will not be where parents need to go for food. The Food Pantry seems to be the logical site for distribution. More discussion will happen so the Weekend Wellness Program can continue in Pal-Mac Schools.

### Food Cupboard "Take what you need, Give what you can."

In the Stewardship mailing mission budget was noted at 10% of the pledges. In order to have funding for the food cupboard, ½ of Fadden pledge will be used. The budget will be discussed at Session. It is hoped Mission and Social Concerns will get a larger part of the budget than projected in the Stewardship letter. Jan and Ruth are tending the cupboard once a week.

Pal-Mac Neighbors will continue to advertise the Food Cupboard – for both users and donors

Good Neighbor Fund Update There remains \$115 designated for Fire Victims

Beginning Balance – 783.12/ 1 deposit of \$25/ 1 check written for \$425 Ending Balance – 383.12/1 rent for 1 adult/ The Good Neighbor Fund is currently closed. **Weekend Wellness update** – This year same as in the past. Foodlink will deliver boxes with 8 bags/box. CORRECTION, the cost to make bags is \$8.00/bag and we are charged only \$3/bag. Foodlink will be charging the full amount next school year which makes it impossible to continue.

Edie attended Food Pantry Board meeting in October. She and the committee brainstormed ways to get Weekend Wellness Food to the families from the food pantry. Pal-Mac Schools will not be where parents need to go for food. The Food Pantry seems to be the logical site for distribution. Nothing was decided, but the process is begun.

Beginning Balance - \$9,855.32/ \$2,000 deposits from AEY/ checks written for \$1456 Ending Balance \$10,399.32/200 bags were delivered in October. Today is the first delivery, and 80 bags will be delivered to the school.

**Next year** Foodlink will continue to do bags, but will charge full price, which makes it impossible to fund. Foodlink supports setting up a food pantry at the school, and school has no space and is resistant to this idea. Foodlink says stigma of Food Pantry will keep parents away from delivering items to the food pantry. We will continue to discuss what will be best for Pal Mac families and develop a plan.

**Reverse Advent Calendar** – beginning November 27 – calendar will be put in newsletter and in bulletins during Advent. Calendar will be shared with Zion, Reformed, Community and Cross Creek churches.

Meals on Wheels – no pay – This is funded by grants.

Pay – Home Meals Service – one we have supported. Persons receiving the lunch pay \$8 or \$5. Our donations help make up the difference for those who don't pay.

**ARC Home** – Cards are being made by Sunday School and Mission will deliver Cards and gift cards to residents at home.

**Christmas Hymn Sing** with donation to Good Neighbor Fund and Food Pantry will be held December 18<sup>th</sup> at 2 pm at Zion.

**Christmas Angels** – Ruth will contact Alicia to see if families with pre-school children can still receive a letter. If so, Ruth and Sally will work to use the Food Pantry records to send letters to Food Pantry clients who have pre-school children. Letter required to be returned by November 9<sup>th</sup>, so quick turn-around time.
