

# WESTERN SPIRE JULY 2023

I've been giving the Angel Tree some thought and often wondered about its origins here at Western Presbyterian Church. And so, one Monday, early in June, I went down to the Archives room to research it a bit.

Originally, before 1993, the Angel Tree was a program run by the Jay-n-Cees. I believe somewhat of an auxiliary organization to the JayCees. In 1993, Diane DeVogelaere volunteered to run the program for Western Presbyterian Church with support given by the Social Concerns committee. In that very first year here at WPC, 100 children and 11 shut ins were served. The program grew steadily. As far as I can tell, in 1996, the Lions Club partnered with the Angel Tree and started doing the delivery, usually done a couple of weeks before Christmas.

In the early days, Christmas trees were distributed to Chase Lincoln Bank, Palmyra Kings Daughter Library, Garlock, Marine Midland Bank and Western Presbyterian Church. Many of those partners are still part of the program today but as some organizations relocated or folded others joined in. Today we partner with Garlock, Palmyra Community Library, JRLON, Macedon Town Hall, and Community Bank. Other organizations help out in other ways: Palmyra Macedon Central School District's office sends out confidential letters to families informing them to send in their Christmas lists that indicate wants and needs of their 16 and younger aged children if they wish to participate. Only families that participate in the free and reduced lunch program at school are invited. Last year, the American Legion in Palmyra became a major player in our program by hosting a wine and cheese event which raised funds and gifts/toys for Angel Tree. Additionally, they have indicated that this event will become a yearly one for them. Creative Environment used to "cut out" our angels, and Junior and Senior High Fellowship used to provide their expertise with wrapping before the program got too big.

I became involved in 2003 as part of Social Concerns and in 2006 after Christmas was over, I volunteered to operate the Angel Tree as a separate entity as it was becoming a major logistical nightmare for the Social/Mission committee. Over the years, many things have changed; all requests are computerized which helps facilitate the printing of labels for our angels instead of several of us handwriting them. Packages are no longer wrapped either but wrapping paper is provided to each family which I believe helps to include the parents more. The Covid years made it hard to operate the Angel Tree as there was no such thing as a reduced or free lunch-they were all free! In 2022, the free and reduced lunch program started back up and things pretty much returned back to normal. Up until Covid, Lions Club had been our faithful delivery partner. In the interest of everyone's health, the decision was made to set up appointments for families to pick up their gifts at church. Although a bit time-consuming, this seemed a good alternative to so many deliveries.

The Angel Tree giving continues, both spiritually and financially, and is still very much appreciated by our "angels". I'm so very proud to be a part of this generous church and this caring community. Merry Christmas and Happy Summer!



We collected **Birthday bags** for the food pantry. They are always a special add for some child's day.



#### Suggestions for Leaders by Sung Hee Chang

The Letter to the Hebrews is a significant book of the Bible, and is also significantly different from every other book in the Bible. It consists of thirteen chapters, all of which are packed with theology, metaphor, comparisons, and spirituality. Therefore, I've decided to approach the letter thematically, not sequentially. We will explore nine major themes, relate those themes to other parts of our faith tradition, and tie them together with the overarching motif of community. The community for which the letter was written interacts, in a sense, with all the communities of which you are a part, because you bring those groups with you wherever you go they have helped to form you into the person you are. The community in which you study and worship, your family and friends, social and therapy groups . . . all are part of you. ### Mission and Social Concerns Minutes: 6-7-2023

Mission Team began with a lighting of the Christ candle, noting he was always a part of the gathering, and opening prayer that we would be able to discern how we should distribute the funding.

In our budget requests we allotted \$2,000 for both the food cupboard and the food pantry. June – December we will have 7 months to spend. That is \$285.71. We decided to assign months to different team members and keep the receipts to be reimbursed. Food and personal care items were discussed and listed items for the cupboard and the food pantry. For the pantry we decided to purchase cereal that children would like and eat, shampoo, toothpaste, dish detergent, and laundry soap. Foodlink has toilet paper so that is not needed at the food pantry.

Edie will see if she can locate small containers to use to fill with laundry detergent to be both economical and serve more families. In the interim we will use laundry pods and make use of sales at Walgreens for laundry detergent and dish detergent.

Weekend Wellness – 10 boxes were delivered to the schools today. That is more than has been delivered all year. No more boxes will be ordered, and arrangements are still in discussion with the food pantry.

Good Neighbor Fund – beginning balance \$831.36 + \$453 contributions

Checks written \$1,200 for 3 rents, serving 4 adults and 2 children.

The ending balance is \$84.36. So, at the end of May, the Fund was closed.

Items approved for distribution at this time:

Synod Mission \$100 General Assembly Mission \$100 Wayne ARC for Meals on Wheels - \$1,000 Healthy Ninos - \$800 plus money contributed by the congregation. Good Neighbor Fund - \$1,000 Domestic Violence - \$1,000 Ruth will contact Qholaqhoe Mountain Connection to ask if they will come for a presentation to the congregation. Determining if sermon or only mission for minute. The Mission Team approved \$1,000 for this mission, but we'd like to give the check the day they are with us.

Edie shared a ministry that had a golf tournament. The Guitars for Glory provide guitars that are used for worship, bringing music to congregations that are without. It was agreed that music is a very important part of worship, and we thought it was an excellent mission to sponsor. 1 guitar for \$300. Edie will fund and will be reimbursed from our budget line.

The meeting was adjourned with the request for prayer for Dorothy Scheele who was hospitalized with a leg problem.

Meeting Started at 6:30 pm

Still do not yet have a quote from Emcor regarding the updates/repairs needed on our boiler system (boiler leak, pilot, zone valves, breathers, etc). Gary confirmed the list with Jeff Izzo of Emcor and expect a quote soon with plan for work to start before they get swamped with AC seasonal maintenance.

The painting of the steeple is on Klingerman's list, waiting for more consistent weather before starting.

Still looking for options for someone to repair the front light that fell from between columns. Want to repair and refinish frame and rebuild fixture before having reinstalled.

Plan to take action on quote from Klingerman Painting for the sealing of the bricks. Gary plans to contact Alan Pulcini to check on options to repoint some areas of the bricks before the sealing process starts.

New computer for church office has arrived, been configured, and installed. First test by Kathy will be on 5/23/23. Finance laptop can connect to Church Database while in church but having issues when connecting from outside church. Researching reasons and trying to find solution.

Waiting on purchase of new AV system laptop to look into other options (network storage device, docking station, editing software etc). Will try to request quote for end of quarter deals from Dell.

Natural Gas supplier options – Taking time to investigate possible companies and costs since current NYSEG option appears to be most cost effective so far.

The Secured mailbox for financial secretary is on schedule to be purchased and mounted.

Previously reported issues with AV system components was probably related to main power issues. Will monitor and report if additional issues appear.

Looking into additional coverage options for AV system for possible time I will be away in June (Courtney or Emily are options)

Scouts from Troop 6166 helped with raking the lawn.

Quote for concrete replacement of part of front parking lot is around \$7,000. Would be replacing full width of parking lot from sidewalk to near corner of church. Check with Session to see if they want to move forward with this project too.

With changes in meter reading requirements with NYSEG, we are still trying to find a simple, secure, and cost-effective way for meters to be read that does not require such a complicated process that Kathy has followed in the past.

For lawn mowing we are considering hiring a student and providing the equipment. Could this be a liability or insurance issue for the church if we "contract" with the student?

Gary working on schedule for install of the cellar door that exits to the front parking lot. The new door is at church, just need to schedule time with people and with dry weather.

In regard to cleaning of church: Gary has been in contact with school and Wayne ARC to investigate training program options that would fit with our upcoming need for a cleaner.

As of May 19<sup>th</sup> – received inquiry from Lea at Camp Whitman regarding the option of counselors staying overnight on June 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> as they receive lifeguard training at Pal-Mac. Session OK with this concept? Will still need to determine how many will be staying, what accommodations are needed, and how (or who) will give access to the church?

As of May 21 – Phil says he can cover AV system operation for both May 28<sup>th</sup> and June 25<sup>th</sup> when James plans on being out of town.
