Women's Circle – February Discussion

Ruth and Redemption

The WPC Sisterhood of Biblical discussion happened around the Book of Ruth this month. We spoke of who we are and who our ancestors were. How did they handle challenges presented to them and how, today, we handle similar kinds of challenges. We are amazed at the traditions in the OT regarding what happens to women who lose their husbands and fathers, their protectors.

Redemption ~ Hopelessness to hope; Suffering to comfort; the hate of rejection to the acceptance of love; all of which lead to joy in the fulfillment of the most basic needs – family and belonging and beyond that to abundance – God still goes this road with us.

We acknowledge that one of the purposes of this book of the Bible is to realize that God puts us where we need to be. God guides us to accept other people of different races and faiths. God showed Ruth and Naomi that sometimes there is more power and strength to give up something safe to be there for someone in need, to walk alongside them. To be stronger together. God suggests through this book that we need to be faithful in character to ourselves and others, even when no one is watching. (To thine own self be true.) God showed through these unique characters that ordinary people

can communicate God's message more effectively at times.

Through Boa, the son of Soloman, acceptance and generosity are a powerful and a healing grace to extend to others. Ruth is a book written by men, but talking about women and how men respond to tragic situations of women. How Ruth and Naomi are redeemed, reflects on the future strength of the heirs of their family. (All the way to the birth of Jesus.)

There is always lively discussion within the safe respectful space within our sisterhood. Please feel free to join us in learning and strengthening your faith walk.



Camp Sunday- 2/12- Cim shared an update on the plans.
